What Are Stem Cells?

View the following video: http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=3Axkn8G18t8. It is prolife, yet demonstrates the difference between the 'making' of adult and embryonic stem cells. Remember, 'stem cell' means that a tissue can develop from a stem cell into an organ, such as a stem cell isolated for bone marrow will eventually, over time make certain blood cells; a stem cell isolated for a kidney will, overtime, make a kidney. To date, only adult stem cells, primarily bone marrow and umbilical cord stem cells, are used in the treatment of certain blood diseases.

- 1. Discuss the difference of HOW stem cells are produced.
- 2. What method of retrieving embryonic stem cells results in lessening organ rejection? [Cloning, see Part 4 of this Bible study]. Based on the Bible's teaching of marriage and procreation, what concerns do you have regarding the production of embryonic stem cells using this method? Why or why not?
- 3. Discuss the two sample comics as a group. Discuss how the comics point out both sides of the Stem Cell Research issue, the desire to heal those we care for with the use of stem cells and the death of human embryos for the stem cell research. What are some of your Christian witness concerns regarding both 'political cartoons'?

- 2. How is this passage related to the 5th commandment and Pastor Martin Luther's explanation? "We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body, but help and support him in every physical need."

- 3. From the preceding Sections/Units, how do you understand the word 'neighbor' that is used in Romans as well as living the life of Christ as a baptized Christian?
