## **SESSION 1: #UNFILTERED**

### **Digging Deeper**

- Esau: acting foolishly but living in the glory knowing you are well liked and received
- Jacob: living a humble life, but having to become someone else just in order to receive a blessing

"Your eyes saw my unformed substance; in your book were written, every one of them, the days that were formed for me, when as yet there was none of them."

Q: Would you rather live out a story written for you by someone you are trying your hardest to please? Or would you rather live out the story that the greatest Author of all times has written for you?

### Closing
